Tommy the Snake Returns for a Surprise Visit

If you were at church on Sunday, November 20, you witnessed the return of Pastor Tom's alter-ego, Tommy the Snake. Sporting dark shades and with a cigarette dangling precariously from his mouth, Tommy arrived unannounced to share with us his unconventional wisdom regarding the gospel lesson from Matthew 25:14-28 in which a master, going on a journey, entrusts his property to his servants. To one he gives five talents, to another two talents and to another one talent. The first two servants put the money to work, doubling the original amounts. But the one who is given one talent buries it, afraid to risk losing it. When the master comes back, he is proud of the first two servants' accomplishments, but he is angry at the third for what he has done (or failed to do). The master has that servant thrown outside into the darkness and gives his talent to the one who has ten.

We know the story well. However, Tommy, with his no-frills approach, presented us with a new interpretation to this familiar parable. His message? Take a risk with what we have been given, even at the risk of failure. So take a moment to think about how YOU can take a risk. Can you welcome a visitor, volunteer with Daybreak, participate in a youth activity, sing in the choir, sew a quilt, reach out to someone who is sick or hurting? Tommy certainly left us with food for thought, didn't he?

Be sure to keep watch—you never know when Tommy the Snake may return!
